



Puppy School

Why is Puppy School Important?

Each year around 600 dogs are euthanased for behavioral issues in Hobart alone, with a large number of these dogs being between 6 and 12 months of age. By enrolling your puppy in Puppy School you are giving it the best possible chance of becoming a responsible canine citizen, and a well loved, well adjusted member of your family.

Puppy School is designed for puppies from the age of 8 weeks, after they have had their first vaccinations and while they are at their most influential stage. Between the ages of 3 and 12 weeks puppies begin to form opinions and habits that will last a lifetime. Early involvement with positive reinforcement is essential for developing a happy and well mannered canine family member.

Puppy School consists of a 1 hour class each week for 4 weeks, held at our veterinary hospital. This gives your puppy an opportunity to become comfortable while at the hospital and will make future visits more enjoyable.

Puppy Program

WEEK ONE:

Settle, come, sit, toilet training, mouthing, chewing, biting & nutrition.

WEEK TWO:

Drop, good manners, children & dogs, body language, wait and stay, physical examinations.

WEEK THREE:

Dog facts, boredom, loose lead walking, health issues, grooming, microchipping, pet insurance.

WEEK FOUR:

Dog senses, non-verbal communication, digging, barking, chewing & biting, jumping up, where to next – GRADUATION!

What to Bring Along

We advise feeding your puppy only half their evening meal before attending so they are not too hungry during class, but at the same time they aren't too full of food and too sleepy to learn. We use reward based training, so they need room to fit in a lot of treats!

Please bring your puppy along on a collar and lead, or a harness. As the class uses positive reinforcement we do not permit the use of check chains.

We would also like you to bring along some super yummy treats for your puppy. We do supply treats in the form of dried liver, but some puppies often require a "higher value" treat such as roast chicken, cheese or a chopped up cocktail sausage to get them to concentrate in the busy environment of puppy class.
